

WINFIELD SCHOLARSHIP FOUNDATION APPLICATION

The Winfield Scholarship Foundation is coordinated with federal and state aid and scholarship funds. Your participation in this program is contingent upon your compliance with a few requirements and the availability of program funds.

To be eligible for the Winfield Scholarship Foundation Scholarship, you must meet the following requirements:

- Graduate high school from Winfield High School as a 2014 graduate.
- Apply for Bevill State institutional scholarships by February 14, 2014.
- Complete the Free Application for Federal Student Aid (FAFSA) at www.fafsa.gov by March 1, 2014.
- Complete Winfield Scholarship Foundation scholarship application and return to Mrs. Weeks by March 1, 2014.
- Enroll as a full-time student (at least 12 academic hours) at Bevill State Community College for the fall and spring semester following your high school graduation.
- With this application, return a 1 page essay stating why you feel you deserve this scholarship, including any hardship information to Mrs. Weeks by March 1, 2014.

Winfield Scholarship Foundation assistance will be available **ONLY** after all applicable federal grants, state grants, and scholarship funds have been awarded and applied toward your tuition. If you refuse a BSCC scholarship, it will still be included in the Winfield Scholarship Foundation calculation. Work study awards and student loans will be excluded from the calculation.

The Winfield Scholarship Foundation is available to you for up to 16 semester hours for the fall semester and spring semester of your freshman year following your high school graduation.

To continue to receive assistance under the Winfield Scholarship Foundation, you must remain a full time student (taking a minimum of 12 hours each semester) with a 2.75 grade point average. If this requirement is not met in the first semester, you will be removed from the program and you will no longer be eligible for Winfield Scholarship Foundation assistance.

By accepting the Winfield Scholarship Foundation scholarship, you are granting Winfield High School and Bevill State Community College permission to release grades, attendance, and/or financial aid information to your parents/guardians and appropriate representatives of the Winfield City Board of Education and the Winfield Scholarship Foundation representatives. This scholarship money is only to be used at BSCC and will not transfer to any other college.

Apply for Bevill State institutional scholarships by February 14, 2014.

Complete the Free Application for Federal Student Aid (FAFSA) at www.fafsa.gov by March 1, 2014.

Complete Winfield Scholarship Foundation scholarship application and a one page essay stating “why you feel you deserve this scholarship” and return to Mrs. Weeks by March 1, 2014.

Enroll as a full-time student (at least 12 academic hours) at Bevill State Community College for the fall and spring semester following your high school graduation.
