Rationale for Judgment of Compliance:

The College has a chief executive officer, Dr. Anne McNutt, who was appointed president by the Alabama State Board of Education on November 13, 2008. Dr. McNutt officially **assumed responsibility** from the interim president, Neal Morrison, on January 15th, 2009. As noted in the president’s **job description**, Dr. McNutt’s primary responsibility is to Bevill State Community College. She is responsible to the Alabama State Board of Education, through the chancellor of the Alabama Department of Postsecondary Education, for the overall leadership and operation of the College and for the purpose of serving the best interests of the students and the community. As chief executive officer of the College, Dr. McNutt is ineligible to be an elected member of the Alabama State Board of Education (**Code of Alabama 16-3-3**). The Governor acts as the president of the Board (State Board **Policy 101.04**).
