## **ALABAMA COMMUNITY COLLEGE SYSTEM NURSING CURRICULUM**

The nursing curriculum is a concept-based curriculum that reflects the stated mission and philosophy of the Alabama Community College System (ACCS) Nursing Programs. To prepare graduates in the role of an associate degree nurse by first integrating the role of a practical nurse, the ACCS has developed a one plus one curriculum that provides students with the education for a practical nursing certificate at successful completion of the third semester; completion of NUR 112, 113, 114 and 115, followed by the incorporation of the competencies required for the associate degree nurse upon successful completion of the last two semesters; NUR 211 and NUR 221 respectively.

The evening (delayed progression) option will meet the need of our nontraditional students and provide an educational option for potential students who are unable to attend college during the day time hours. The evening track is eight semesters with campus labs, clinical and classes offered in the evening hours and/or weekends. Courses have been carefully planned to provide the student with a continuity of learning experiences. The evening option was designed for students to complete required academic classes during the summer semester upon admission to the nursing program.

When delivering direct patient care, students are supervised by faculty. In the campus nursing laboratory, simulation and instruction are directed through hands-on practice and facilitate by personal contact and by visual, computer-assisted, interactive and other multimedia stimuli.

The faculty strives to produce graduates capable of self-direction, who are willing to assume responsibility and accountability for their practice in the health care delivery system.

**MINIMUM ADMISSION STANDARDS**

**Please check the following minimum admission standards before submitting your application.**

- \_\_\_ 1. Unconditional admission to the college (Application must be updated if student did not attend BSCC the previous semester).
  
- \_\_\_ 2. Original transcripts **from all colleges** attended must be in the Office of Student Services by the nursing application deadline. Unlike routine college admission, the nursing department does not allow one semester to receive transcripts. Transcripts must be sent by the institution directly to the BSCC Central Records Office. Transferable course work must be completed at a regionally accredited college or university.
  
- \_\_\_ 3. A complete nursing application must be submitted online via the BSCC college Website.
  
- \_\_\_ 4. A minimum of 18 ACT composite score (writing component not required), National or Residual, is required and ACT results must be attached to this application. There is no expiration date on ACT for this nursing application.
  - ❖ **ACT Scores from residual testing are valid only at the college and cannot be transferred by transcript or other means to any other institution or agency. The only exception is a waiver agreement between ACCS and ACT to allow the exchange of scores among the Alabama Community College System colleges.**
  
- \_\_\_ 5. A minimum of 2.5 GPA is required on a 4.0 scale based on the nursing required academic core courses. The core college courses are English Composition 1, Intermediate College Algebra, Anatomy & Physiology I, Anatomy and Physiology II, Microbiology, Human Growth & Development, Speech and a Humanities Elective (Art or Music Appreciation, Philosophy, Ethics, Religion, or a foreign language)
  
- \_\_\_ 6. A minimum of 2.5 GPA is required for high school students without prior college work (GED acceptable).
  
- \_\_\_ 7. Completion of the prerequisite academic courses of Principles of Biology (BIO 103) and General Psychology (PSY 200).
  
- \_\_\_ 8. Eligibility is required for English Composition I, Intermediate College Algebra, and Anatomy & Physiology I if not previously taken
  
- \_\_\_ 9. Good standing with the College; including minimum overall, cumulative GPA of 2.0 is required.

- \_\_\_10. Meet the Health Science Essential Functions (verified by Health Care Provider).
- \_\_\_11. Name of application is current legal name and matches copy of photo ID and name in BSCC system.
- \_\_\_12. Upon conditional admission to the nursing program, a clear Background screening will be required for enrollment in the nursing program.
- \_\_\_13. Upon conditional admission, applicant must provide verification of health insurance coverage, as well as maintain their health insurance coverage through the nursing curriculum.
- \_\_\_14. Required to have current American Heart Association CPR card at BLS provider or enroll for EMS 100 with lab during first semester of nursing curriculum.

## **POINTS FOR ADMITTANCE TO NURSING**

**After meeting all minimum admission requirements, applicants are rank ordered using the following point system:**

- ACT composite national or residual score of (36 points maximum possible). The writing component is not required. No time limit on ACT results. Applicant will be awarded points for his/her composite ACT score. A minimum composite score of 18 on ACT is required for eligibility to apply. ACT results must be attached to the application.
- Points will be awarded for grades in English Composition I, Intermediate College Algebra, Anatomy & Physiology I and Anatomy and Physiology II. The following scale will be used to assign points: A=3 points, B= 2 points, C=1 point.
- Four points may be awarded, one point each for completion **at BSCC** of Microbiology, Human Growth & Development, Fundamentals of Speech, and a Humanities elective (Art or Music Appreciation, Philosophy, Ethics, Religion or foreign language) with a grade of C or higher.
- Two points will be awarded for students who have attended Beville State Community College for at least one semester (BSCC Loyalty points)
- Four points are awarded for completion (at BSCC or another institution/ university) of Chemistry, Pre-calculus/ Finite math, English Composition II or Statistics with a C or higher. Only four points total are awarded.

A total of 58 points are possible with these selection criteria. If there is a tie in points in relation to the number of available spaces, then the higher cumulative GPA will be considered.

Priority for admission is given to first time applicants. Readmission/reinstatement as well as transfer students are considered on a space available basis.

High school students may obtain points for college courses through dual enrollment.
